### REGULATORY

- ✓ CALEA—A draft will be shared with this committee within the next few weeks (the legal department is still making edit suggestions). This document is confidential since it is still in draft form, and it covers information pertaining to our degree of CALEA compliance (see [www.calea.org](http://www.calea.org)). (Back in 2005-2006, CALEA (the Communications Assistance for Law Enforcement Act) was being expanded to cover broadband providers and VoIP. Networks are exempt from the electronic surveillance rules if they meet two tests: they must be private, and the institution that runs them must not "support" the Internet connection.)
- ✓ PCI—Any campus credit card transactions transmitted over data connections (e-commerce) should be discussed with Bill Cummins, \_\_\_\_\_ Committee chair, as additional constraints will be added over the next 90 days. (The PCI Security Standards Council is an open global forum for the ongoing development, enhancement, storage, dissemination and implementation of security standards for account data protection.)
- ✓ ESI—Electronically stored information (ESI) has new federal regulatory issues. Two key issues: 1) retention timeframe of data, and 2) destruction of data no longer necessary to keep. Scott will email us ACUTA's "What Every Institution Should Know About IP-Video and the New Federal Rules" web seminar handout from June 2007.

### WIRELESS

- ✓ Future of GuestNet—Due to CALEA restraints, GuestNet has halted growth.
- ✓ Sponsored Guests—As a substitution for GuestNet, sponsored access with a Web page request form will be developed.
- ✓ Secured Access—To assist with secured access across campus, the strategy proposed is ending the AGIS contract by the end of this year (affects palm pilot users).
- ✓ Long-term Planning—A comprehensive, indoor/outdoor, campus-wide wireless access plan is being developed, however, funding is an issue. There are 200 more wireless access points identified which are necessary to complete this project.

### SECURITY

- ✓ Policy Committees—There are 2 separate committees, one for data security and one for network security.
- ✓ Centralized Logging—New infrastructure threats coming are host-based. Currently, we are successfully blocking some threats, but we need to investigate a centralized logging platform to aid in \_\_\_\_\_. A centralized logging platform will allow us to collect system logs from different places and platforms to consolidate logs for pattern recognition. Centralized logging will allow delegation of rolls for using various tools/appliances on their own logs.
