Old Business

EOL for Mallard

Mark reminded the Council of its decision to endorse an end-of-life for Mallard on campus. He mentioned that he met with Sarah Walczynski to step up the work needed to move faculty who were using Mallard to a new system, such as WebCT. She indicated that there were still about 265 courses to be converted.

Classroom Clickers

The Council discussed endorsement of the Classroom Clickers proposal submitted by Doug Smith. The expressed a desire to have a few more questions answered before reaching a final decision. The questions centered on whether to pursue Option 1 (student pays full price for new clickers) or Option 2 (the university supplements the cost of the clickers by paying the perpetual license fee):

- Is the license tied to the device?
 - What if it is lost? Must the license be repurchased?
 - What if the student graduates? Will the university need to buy another license?
- What would it take to give a rebate of the license fee to the student? (That is, choose Option 1 but set a rebate for those students who pursue it...)

Shared personal calendar research

The Council discussed the shared personal calendaring presentations from the last meeting and decided to wait until the Exchange Consolidation project is discussed. Two questions to address:

- What are the number of Eudora users now? Outlook users?
- A group calendar can be created in SunJES.
 - Can anyone use another's group calendar?
 - How are group calendars managed when membership in the group changes?

New Business

Discussion of "Top Ten IT Issues..." from advisory committees

The Council began a discussion of the items included in the summaries of the IT issues reported by the constituent and technical advisory committees. Most of the summaries were in, but further discussion was postponed until the November 28 meeting.
